### **NEU Industrial Action on Wednesday 1 February – partial school closure**

As I mentioned in my previous letter, there will, unfortunately, be some disruption to school on Wednesday 1 February as a result of the strike action. We have tried our best to minimise this disruption and have offered provision to students who may need it the most. As we do not know how many teaching staff we will have in school on Wednesday, we have taken the decision to close the school to all students apart from those who are eligible for Free School Meals and have requested to attend school.

If you have requested provision for your young person, you will receive an email confirming this and the school day will operate as normal. **For all other students in Years 7-13 school will be closed**, but work will be available on Showbie to complete. However, there will be no live lessons and staff will not be setting specific work or marking any completed work during this day.

All students attending school on Wednesday 1 February will be able to access school meals as normal. Students who qualify for free school meals but are not attending on Wednesday 1 February will be able to collect a grab-bag at the end of the day on Tuesday 31 January. If your young person is not attending on Wednesday 1 February and you have not yet requested a grab-bag, please email [questions@elawnswood.co.uk](mailto:questions@elawnswood.co.uk) by 4pm on Monday 30 January to order one.

All our staff are committed to doing the very best they can for our students. I know that staff who have made the decision to strike have not done so without a lot of thought. I hope you understand the desire of NEU members to campaign for a better funded education system.

### **Year 10 Target Setting**

We strongly believe that a target only has meaning if the student sets it for themselves, and has thought deeply about what they need to do in order to attain that target.
