Key Stage 4

Results have improved significantly from 2015/16, and the schools estimated Progress 8 (P8) score is likely to be above 0. Indicating that students do at least as well as other schools nationally and better in some areas. We will not know the validated P8 score until January 2018.

We are pleased to report that the difference in performance between disadvantaged students and other students has been significantly diminished, as has the difference between the performance of boys and girls.
