# Mayors Innovation Challenge - Young People (16-26)

A unique learning opportunity for young people. Over a period of five months young people will develop new skills, meet new people and develop work that will benefit them in the future. We know young people seek happier and healthier lives within the region, and so this programme takes young people on a unique learning journey, supporting them to create new ideas to solve this problem at a local level. All teams or individuals who develop an idea and complete the challenge programme will win a £100 voucher. The ideas will also be assessed against three additional criteria sets, giving participants a further opportunity to win prizes worth up to £625. There are only 35 spaces on the programme (a space can be taken by an individual or a team of up to three people), and applicants are split into three age categories: 16-18, 19-22, 23-16.

To secure a place, young people need to send a complete application form that enables us to understand innovation mindset: their approach to empathy and their interest and motivation for joining the challenge and tackling health and happiness challenges of young people. The applications are scored and the top 11 from each age category will be offered a place. **Those who don't gain a place will still be invited to an online innovation 101 learning session.** The young cohort will go through a brand new learning journey, designed to be inclusive and enjoyable. We've added flexibility within the programme. Four core learning sessions will be mandatory but they'll be additional, complementary opportunities designed to appeal to specific strengths and interests.

#### Timeline - Feb-June 2025

- Challenge launches, applications open:: w/c 10 February
- Applications close: 10 April
- Cohort selected: w/c 14 April young people informed via text/email
- First core learning Innovation 101: **Sat 26 April**, 10am-3pm, in person
- Second core learning Problem Definition: Thur 8 May 5-7pm, online
- Third core learning Prototype/Test: Sun 25 May, 10am-3pm, in person
- Fourth core learning Prepare a pitch: **Sun I June**, 10am-3pm, in person
- Final celebration event Wed/Thurs 25/26June, 5-7:30, in person
- All additional sessions (called 'skills builder' and 'change maker' sessions) are between 30-90 minutes in length, and take place online, in between each of the core sessions
- All in person sessions will take place in West Yorkshire .

#### A note on accessibility and inclusion

We are taking the following steps to increase the accessibility of the programme:

- Welcoming a 'trusted adult' of any young person/team who needs support. Those with additional accessibility needs can bring a trusted adult to attend the in-person sessions with them
- Young people will be able to opt-out of any activity they do not feel comfortable participating in
- There will be 'quiet spaces' within each in-person session where any young people can go if they are overwhelmed at any point.
