




You can find great stories to read for free as books or on line from Leeds City Libraries



Join online by completing the form. You'll then receive an email with your temporary card number and you can set your own pin


You get a temporary membership number sent by email straight away and then your card is posted to you.


And you can borrow the available titles. There is no due return date for the books and even better, no fines!

In the Summer Reading Challenge you must complete tasks about the books you read to earn points. Then enter the level of your choosing. The best entries will win: **Supercharge** – Prizes – Amazon vouchers up to £30: 15-31 points Turbocharge – Prizes – Amazon vouchers up to £50: 32 points or more

Information about the tasks you can do to earn points is on the <u>Summer Reading</u> <u>Challenge letter</u>. You should hand in or send a portfolio of your work to

We will then judge the winning entries at each level.

Here are some examples of the tasks on the list:

- 1 point Make a **timeline** of you novel.
- 2 points Summarise the feelings in your story in **a flowchart or series of pictures.**
- 3 points Make up 10 quiz questions about your novel.
- 4 points **Rewrite** the last page of the novel so that it has a completely different ending.

| 1 point per task on this row | Make a timeline of your novel. | Draw a sketch of 2 of the settings in your novel. | Write everything you know about one of the characters in your story. | Make a list of books that you have read over the summer holidays. |

| 2 points per task on this row | Summarise the feelings in your story in a flowchart or series of pictures. | Make a list of the positive events of your story and the negative events. Use two columns. | Give reasons why your character behaves as they do in your story. | Make a questionnaire that collects information about what each person in your family like to read. |
| 3 points per task on this row | Make up 10 quiz questions about your novel. | Write the "blurb" for your story. | Compare two characters from the novel, showing similarities and differences between them. | Write a joint review with your parent or carer, where you write one paragraph and your parents/carer write a second. |
| 4 points per task on this row | Rewrite the last page of the novel so that it has a completely different ending. | Write a diary entry from one of your minor characters reflecting on the events of the story. | Mind-map the main themes and ideas if your story with examples and pictures. | Create a photo collage of your family and friends reading odd places around the house or your local area. You could draw pictures too. |
