Why we are so proud of our Sixth Form

It has been wonderful to spend the last month interviewing Year 11 students who are hoping to secure a place with us next year.

One of the most important factors a young person should consider when deciding where to study next is whether the school will deliver strong academic outcomes, and whether they are likely to get better results at Lawnswood than elsewhere. I am pleased to report that A level results from last summer have now been validated by the Department for Education, and students who study at Lawnswood Sixth Form make consistently better progress than they would if they study elsewhere. In fact, in terms of the A level points scores students attain, our sixth form is ranked in the top 17% of all sixth forms and colleges nationally, and in terms of the percentage of top A level grades secured we fall in the top 9% nationally! So, if your child has not submitted their application to the sixth yet, there is still time. We want every one of our Year 11 students to stay with us, if they meet our entry requirements, as we know we can support them to get the best possible grades at age 18.

Not only are the academic results important but our sixth formers also enjoy one of the widest enrichment programmes on offer and that is why they are so successful in securing places at university and on apprenticeships.

Why be a Surgeon Event?

Ten of our Year 12 students were invited to participate in an outreach initiative organised by the BHS, which is a national society for Hip Surgeons in the UK. They hosted an annual scientific meeting at the Harrogate Convention Centre giving our students an insight into the diverse range of careers related to Trauma and Orthopaedic Surgery. The engaging and informative sessions provided an overview of careers in surgery, working in operating theatres, industry roles and an Industry Exhibition Tour, which was thoroughly enjoyed by students and staff.

The Brilliant Club Scholars Programme

I would also like to highlight the success of our Year 12 students who are enrolled on the Brilliant Club programme and enjoying the tutorials including the practical sessions focused on Neuroscience. The programme allows our students to work with a PhD tutor from the University of Leeds to develop their subject knowledge and passion for learning in a small group setting. It helps them to develop their knowledge, skills and confidence to support them in securing a place at a competitive university. Students are now working with their tutor to begin writing their assignments.









School trips update

Year 10 sport pupils had a fantastic day at Herd Farm Activity Centre last week completing assessed activities including a high ropes course for the practical aspect of their course. Next week is a bumper week for trips, including our first overseas residential of the year: 40 pupils from Years 8 & 9 are journeying to Reims in France on a trip run jointly by the languages and science departments. Closer to home, Year 10 pupils are attending a secret location for a languages-themed workshop run by employees of government intelligence agencies; pupils from Years 7-10 are due to attend a singing workshop with other local schools; Year 9 and 10 pupils have a fantastic opportunity to take part in a trial for British Cycling; and Year 9 and 10 design technology pupils will be competing in a design competition against other Leeds schools.
