Entry Requirements

To study Law at A level you will need grade 6+ in GCSE English Language.



Knowledge & Skills gained:

- Develop knowledge and understanding of selected areas of the law of England, Wales and Northern Ireland and sustain their enjoyment of, and interest in, the subject of Law.
- Develop an understanding of legal method and reasoning.
- Develop the ability to communicate legal arguments and conclusions with reference to appropriate legal authority.
- Develop a critical awareness of the changing nature of law in society and develop the techniques of logical thinking and the skills necessary to analyse and solve problems by applying legal rules.

Complementary Subjects

There are no requirements to study Law along other specific subjects, but many of our students also take other social science A levels such as Psychology, Politics and Sociology as well as Business Studies. Law also lends itself to combining effectively with Modern Foreign and Community languages, as well as English, History and Biology.

Future Opportunities

University – Many students go on to read Law or Law related degrees. In recent years this has included both Oxbridge and LSE. Law is a highly regarded A Level, which promotes progression to full H.E./career opportunities as well as preparing potential law students for the academic rigour necessary for a degree in law. It provides grounding for many professional qualifications/businesses most of which have integral law component. The course also deals with Human Rights Act and European Union Law both of which are basic to most professional fields. All previous students have gone onto successfully pursue their legal studies at the university of their choice including Oxbridge.

Employment opportunities – Law is in demand and a well-respected academic subject. Students take up careers in wide-ranging career fields including both the private and public sector.
